

Urgent Need for Furniture Donations: Calgary's Women In Need Society (WINS) Calls on Calgarians to Help Those Less Fortunate in Our Community

WINS is asking Calgarians to donate gently used living room, bedroom and kitchen furniture to help address needs for basic goods for Calgary families

CALGARY – January 13, 2023 – Local organization Women in Need Society (WINS) is urgently asking the Calgary community to donate gently used furniture and household items in response to a critical need among the most vulnerable sectors of the city's population. Many Calgary families currently are living without adequate living room, kitchen, and bedroom items.

According to Karen Ramchuk, CEO of WINS, furniture and housewares items are facing the highest demand in recent times, with WINS seeing more than 120 families a week requiring support from WINS' House to Home program. She says, "We are calling on Calgarians to donate essential kitchen, living room and bedroom furniture and household items to help families make a home for themselves. People who are coming to WINS for urgent help are Calgarians and they are starting over. Let's help them get on their feet again."

Clients include refugees from around the world, women and children fleeing violence and domestic abuse situations, families facing poverty and many other dire situations.

Large furniture items and gently used mattresses are accepted at the Dover and Macleod Trail Plaza WINS thrift store locations, or the WINS Donation Centre. Click here for drop off details and addresses, or to schedule a collector service.
